

Princeville Village Board Minutes

April 21, 2015

7:30 PM

The Princeville Village Board met on the above date and time at the Village Hall. President Stahl called the meeting to order with the following members answering roll: Sutherland, Troutman, Koller, Carton and Haley. Trustee Gilroy arrived immediately after roll. A quorum was present for the meeting. Notice of the meeting and the agenda were sent and received in a timely manner. Others present were Clerk Mercer and Superintendent of Public Works Gardner.

Police Report: Officer gave an overview of arrest and calls for the past month. He mentioned that a lot of the incidents stem from the VFW. Discussion was held of the issues resulting from VFW. The officer had written two ordinance tickets.

Trustee Gilroy reported some suspicious activity in Cutter's Grove. This will be monitored. Discussion was held in regards to monitoring the parks with cameras.

PCA: Julie Delbridge reported the PCA has made two donations of \$500.00 each. One to the Troutman Park Foundation for Troutman's Trek. The other to the Princeville Little League to help with the Brad Wallin Tournament. Julie is working with Jan Blank in preparing the Village for the tournament, which is to be held June 2-5th.

Julie also reported that the Journal Star is running a series about small towns and there will be an article about Princeville in the Sunday April 26, 2015 edition.

Report from Municipal Code Officer: Officer not available. Revised animal ordinance was available for review. Discussion held. Trustee Carton made a motion to table the ordinance for further review. Second by Trustee Gilroy. President Stahl, voice vote. All ayes. No nays. Motion carried.

Committee Reports: Pool committee met Sunday, April 19th, with the pool manager, Nate Rice. Pool will open May 23, 2015 at 12:00 pm (weather permitting). Discussed wages for upcoming season and topic was put on hold till the next meeting, in which Trustee Troutman will bring a final draft for the board to review.

Discussion held on adult swim time, seems like no one is using it.

Discussion held for cost of admission, fees and passes for the upcoming pool season. Draft of recommended cost was available for review by the board. Trustee Sutherland made a motion to accept the proposed admission rates for

the 2015 pool season. Second by Trustee Sutherland. President Stahl, roll call vote. Trustees Sutherland, Troutman, Koller, Gilroy, Carton and Haley voting aye. No nays. Motion carried.

The approved cost of admission are as follows:

Individual Season Pass – Village of Princeville Resident \$150.00
Non-Resident \$200.00

Family Season Pass – (Family of no more than four, additional \$20.00 per family member over 4 members) - Village of Princeville Resident \$200.00
Non-Resident \$275.00

Multi-Visit passes (multi-Visit Passes do not expire at the end of the season and can be used until all 20 General Admission entries are used)

Purchased before May 22, 2015 – Village of Princeville Resident \$58.50
Non-Resident \$76.50

Purchased on or After May 22, 2015 – Village of Princeville Resident \$65.00
Non-Resident \$85.00

Swimming Lessons: Cost is \$45.00 for one session and \$70.00 for both. Session one is from June 8 to June 26. Session two is from July 6 to July 24th.

Finance Committee: Working on budget for new fiscal year.

Consider and vote on bids for new mower: Supt. of Public Works Gardner had received two bids for new mower to be used for mowing the parks. The current mower will be used mowing Aten Acres and rougher terrains. Bids as follows: Smith Brothers – Scagg, zero turn, 35hp -\$10,200.00, German-Bliss – Xmark, zero turn, 30hp - \$11,119.00. Trustee Carton made a motion to accept and purchase the Scagg, zero turn, 35hp mower from Smith Brothers for \$10,200.00. Second by Trustee Troutman. President Stahl, roll call vote. Trustees Sutherland, Troutman, Koller, Gilroy, Carton and Haley voting aye. No nays. Motion carried.

Consider and Vote on a liquor license for the May 16th fund raiser for Troutman Park: Trustee Koller made a motion to issue the liquor license thru the VFW for the Troutman Park fund raiser to be held May 16th, 2015 at the park. Second by Trustee Sutherland. President Stahl roll call vote. Trustees Sutherland, Koller, Gilroy, Carton and Haley voting aye. Trustee Troutman abstain. No nays. Motion carried.

Building Permits: None

Report from Superintendent of Public Works: Upgrade of Walnut Avenue should begin on Monday April 27, 2015. Truck will be routed into town from the South. A roadway to FCA was installed today, April 21, 2015.

Some curb, gutter and approach work needs to be done at Village Foods. The cost will be approximately \$8,500.00.

Work on Pool will start in the next week or so.

Working on past due water accounts. One household had to be shut off for non-payment.

Work will need to be done on Cottage Grove Ave., Supt. is getting bids. The County may help out. Trustee Carton mentioned the intersection of Route 90 and Cottage Grove is in much need of repair again.

Any other business to be brought before board:

The Polar Bear will be opening soon with new owners, Chad and Becky Gardner.

A report of fund transfers was provided to the board by Treasurer Hofer and discussed. Trustee Troutman made a motion to approve the F15 fund transfers, with a second by Trustee Koller. President Stahl, roll call vote. Trustees Sutherland, Troutman, Koller, Gilroy, Carton and Haley voting aye. No nays. Motion carried.

The Fast Stop may have a new owner as of April 22, 2015. If this is the case, President Stahl will pull their liquor license, as they do not transfer with change of ownership. Trustee Carton made a motion to issue the new owner a liquor license, once the background check is completed. Second by Trustee Haley. President Stahl, roll call vote. Trustees Sutherland, Troutman, Koller, Gilroy, Carton and Haley voting aye. No nays. Motion carried.

Trustee Troutman made a request that the Peoria County Sherriff to attend one of the board meetings. It has been awhile seen he has been to a board meeting.

Discussed Troutman Park's camera system, and that they are soon will be adding hand dryers to the restrooms, and playground equipment.

Trustee Gilroy and Village Clerk Mercer will attend the Tenth Biennial Municipal Law Seminar, Saturday May 9, 2015.

Trustee Koller made a motion to adjourn, with a second by Trustee Carton. President Stahl voice vote. All ayes, no nays. Motion Carried. President Stahl, adjourned the meeting at 8:40 p.m.
